Dear Nancy,

I have reviewed the seed mixture which you sent to me on July 1, 1980. I have several comments:

1. All of the grasses are introduced species.
2. The seed mixture should be about 18 to 20 pounds/acre if a measure of pure live seed (p.l.s.) is not accounted for in the mixture. If p.l.s. is used then 9-12 lbs may be adequate.
3. The use of seedlings should be strongly considered. Either bare-root or containerized stock would provide for more rapid re-establishment of vegetation.

Attached is a list of appropriate native species with some indication of seed availability and a list of sources for further checking if you wish to do so.
