RE: Sediment Control

Dear Mr. Otani:

The enclosed state sample analysis 822405 indicates an unsatisfactory 78,500 mg/l total suspended solids (TSS) discharge to waters of the state near Clear Creek, Utah. A May 26, 1982 memorandum from The Utah Division of Oil, Gas and Mining mentioned that this discharge resulted from the runoff of snow and wastes you had contracted to remove from Valley Camp of Utah.

Since the disposal of this waste caused the unsatisfactory discharge in violation of the Utah Water Pollution Control Act, we request that you submit the following information to this office by August 1, 1982:

1. Map showing the exact location of the disposal area.
2. Measures which have been taken or will be taken to prevent reoccurrence of the problem.
3. Diagram and design of any sediment control structures.
4. Operating procedures to prevent similar unsatisfactory discharges.
