Dear Mr. Whiteside:

The following truck scale installation can not be approved until the following concerns are addressed. The concerns are as follows:

1. Adequate grading must be provided as stated in the plan to direct runoff into the existing sediment facilities.
2. It is not acceptable to allow the first 75 feet of road to filter through straw bales, since this is considered a maintenance problem and cannot be relied upon to provide adequate protection. The area west of the Truck Scale is shown on drawing no. A4-0058 to drain into the Highway ditch. Both the first 75 feet of approach to the Truck Scale and the area west of the Truck scale must have adequate sediment control. The current method is unacceptable. A small settling basin or ditch conveyance to the existing sediment pond are two possible suggestions. Please address mitigation of this problem.

Any approval is contingent on adequate responses to these concerns.
