RE: PAP Amendment, Small Area Exemptions, Valley Camp of Utah, Belina Complex, ACT/007/001-88F, Folder #2, Carbon County, Utah.

SUMMARY:

A request was received at the division offices on October 7, 1988 to classify 8 areas at the Belina Complex as "Small Area Exemptions." Small Area exemptions are allowed by section UMC 817.42(C) of the Utah regulations.

ANALYSIS:

During the July 7, 1988 inspection, it was noted that three areas did not drain to a sediment pond. At that time, the operator was given 90 days to address these areas. Later TDN 88-02-107-8 was issued by Rade Orell for failure to pass surface drainage through a sediment pond. A couple of additional areas were sited in the TDN.

Subsequent to the Federal Inspection, three additional areas have been located bringing the total to 8 areas that do not drain to a sediment pond.

All of these areas are depicted on the Small Area Exemption sheet supplied by Valley Camp.

Onsite inspection of these areas confirm that alternate sediment control is being used for these areas as described on the Valley Camp sheet. This alternate sediment control should be adequate to control sediment in those areas.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the division approve small area exemption status for all 8 areas as requested by Valley Camp.

Valley Camp must continue to provide alternate sediment control in all of these areas and in the event sediment control becomes inadequate, provide additional sediment control as needed.
