N91-38-2-2, VALLEY CAMP COAL :

CARBON COUNTY, UTAH : CAUSE NO. ACT/007/001

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By letter dated August 28, 1991, Valley Camp of Utah requested that the Division vacate the above-referenced violation because the storm event exceeded the 10 year 6 hour design criteria required for the structure. Supporting documentation was attached with the letter. On September 13, 1991, Division staff submitted a technical memorandum which reviewed the storm event and design criteria issues.

The following Findings, Conclusions, and Order are based on the technical information and recommendations provided in these documents.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. NOV #N91-38-2-2 was written for violation of Utah Admin. R614-301-742.300 and R614-301-742.312.
2. The request for vacation of violation N91-38-2-2 was properly submitted to the Division.
3. The technical information submitted in the letter from Valley Camp of Utah, dated August 28, 1991, and the technical evaluation prepared by Rick P. Summers, Senior Hydrologist for the Division, dated September 13, 1991, verify that the storm event which caused violation N91-38-2-2 exceeded the 10 year 6 hour design criteria required for the structure.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Because the storm event which caused the referenced violation N91-38-2-2 to occur, exceeded the 10 year 6 hour design criteria which was required for the structure, the operator is not at fault for the violation.

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ORDER

NOW THEREFORE, it is ordered that:

1. Violation N91-38-2-2 is vacated.
