FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Due and regular notice of the time, place, and purpose of the hearing was given to all interested parties in the form and manner and within the time required by law and the rules and regulations of the Board.
2. The Board has jurisdiction over this matter and over the parties interested therein and has authority to issue the Order hereinafter set forth.
3. The Division received on September 21, 1976 a copy of drawing number GENU268-D, entitled "5 Year Projection-Composite Plan", and depicted on that drawing is the approximate location of the shaft which is the subject of this hearing.
4. The approximate location of the ventilation shaft was included in those Mining and Reclamation Plans that were tentatively approved by the Division on May 14, 1977. An approved Notice of Intent to Mine was issued based upon such plans.


5. The raise bore shaft that is the subject of this hearing will be used for mine ventilation and will include a hoist to be used periodically for shaft inspection.
6. The surface disturbance associated with the shaft will be less than one acre and all disturbance will be designed and constructed to be in compliance with both State and Federal performance standards.
7. The work on the shaft facility is merely an amplification of detail on the previously submitted and approved mine plan.

ORDER

It is therefore Ordered By the Board that:

1. Work may proceed on the ventilation shaft in the manner that was presented in this hearing.
2. The staff of the Division should be informed of work progress on the project and may require additional compliance measures as it deems necessary.
