## Crews Start Reclamation Work At Canyonlands, Capitol Reef

Utah's Abandoned Mine Reclamation Program has joined forces with the National Park Service to begin reclamation work in the Canyonlands National Park and Capitol Reef National Park.

In Canyonlands, the Lathrop Canyon Project involves closing 10 uranium-mine openings by installing cable-net closures, according to the Utah Department of Natural Resources Division of Oil, Gas and Mining.

Due to the sensitive environment, materials and equipment will be helicoptered into the Canyonlands site and workers will hike to the area dai-

ly, the department said.

The Terry Mine Project in Capitol Reef involves two uranium mines that will be backfilled. Spoils will be removed, and the land will be revegetated and regraded.

The Abandoned Mine Reclamation Program is donating personnel time and expertise to the project. The National Park Service will foot the bill, which for the two projects is estimated at \$28,000.

Work in Canyonlands is scheduled for completion by March 1990. The Capitol Reef project will be finished next week.
