Dear Johnny:

This letter will confirm our discussions with you regarding our future use of the Crandall Canyon property we are acquiring from Plateau.

The property will be used by me and by my family and friends for recreational purposes such as camping, hiking, hunting and horseback riding. That has been and continues to be our whole reason for this family acquisition. We do not intend to use the property for commercial purposes of any kind. Rather, we will keep the property in as pristine a condition as possible without disturbing the existing contour of the land or the existing ground cover. In this regard, we would greatly prefer and see no reason for C-Canyon, L.C., not to leave the existing contour and ground cover in the leach field area as it exists rather than disturb the surface which is now stable and well protected. Much of the vegetation there now is a sod-forming grass that will be good for camping and will decrease erosion. Further, the present condition does not vary significantly from its approximate original contour.

As you are aware, it is absolutely essential to our future use of the property that the road access be maintained from the bottom of the canyon up to and through the leach field to connect to the old road in the area above the leach field. This is an additional reason to leave the existing contour as it now is. And upon becoming owner of the property and after release of the bond, we are willing to accept maintenance of the roadway.
