## **SUMMARY:**

On May 18, 2005, the Division received proposed changes to relocated confidential or protected documents from Castle Gate Mine MRP.

Regulatory Reference: 30 CFR 777.13; R645-301-130.

**Analysis:**

The MRP does not meet the requirements of R645-300-124.330 because there are mislocated confidential documents in the Permittee's volumes.

The Permittee must relocate the confidential or protected historical or biological resource documents from the MRP to the Castle Gate Confidential Binder. Replace individual reports with reference sheets. These sheets will provide the following information: (R645-300-124.330)

- Vol. IV, Ch. 5, Appendices 5A through 5F (and names of the exhibits) have been relocated to the Confidential Binder and the date of relocation.
- Vol. V, Ch. 10, Appendices 10C and 10D have been relocated to the Confidential Binder and the date of relocation.

**Findings**

Information provided in the plan does not meet the minimum Reporting of Technical Data in General Content's requirements of the regulations. Prior to approval, the Permittee must act in accordance with the following:

**R645-300-124.300**, The Permittee must relocate the confidential or protected historical or biological resource documents from the MRP to the Castle Gate Confidential Binder. Replace individual reports with reference sheets. These sheets will provide the following information: • Vol. IV, Ch. 5, Appendices 5A through 5F (and names of the exhibits) have been relocated to the Confidential Binder and the date of relocation. • Vol. V, Ch. 10, Appendices 10C and 10D have been relocated to the Confidential Binder and the date of relocation.

**RECOMMENDATIONS:**

Do not approve the amendment until the Permittee addresses all deficiencies.
