DRILLING

If a particular drill hole has been selected for hydrological monitoring, upon completion of said monitoring, the drill hole will be cemented from top to bottom.

REVEGETATION

The following is a revision of our species mix that will be used for revegetation of disturbed areas:

Lupine	1 lb/acre
Mountain Brome (Lincoln)	3-4 lbs/acre
Timothy or Meadow Foxtail	$\frac{1}{2}$ lb/acre
Yellow Sweet Clover	1-2 lbs/acre
American Sweetvetch	1-2 lbs/acre
Western Wheatgrass	1-2 lbs/acre
Perennial Rye	1-2 lbs/acre

The Lupine has been added to the original list, the American Sweetvetch was substituted for Alfalfa from the original list, Western Wheatgrass was substituted for Orchard Grass from the original list, and Timothy has been reduced from 1-2 lbs/acre on the original list to $\frac{1}{2}$ lb/acre.

LAND OWNER PERMISSION

As stated in our previously filed Notice of Intent, there are no state or federal surface lands involved in our Scofield Mine Project. The surface lands are all controlled by private landowners. In addition, there are no federal or state coal reserves involved in the development of our Scofield Mine. Carbon County is the owner and lessor to UCO of a portion of the coal reserves; the remainder of the coal reserves proposed to be developed by the Scofield Mine are owned by UCO, Inc. (see attached maps)
