RE: Mine Discharge Greater Than 240,000 Gallons Per Day, L AB
Utah Fuel Company, Skyline Mine, ACT/007/005, #9,
Carbon County, Utah

On September 25, 1984, Lowell P. Braxton was contacted by Keith Zobell stating that the underground mine discharge pump system developed problems over the weekend resulting in intermittent operation for the past 36 hours. They will verify strip recorder readings in this regard. The purpose of the call was to notify the Division of Oil, Gas and Mining (DOG M) of a discharge in excess of 240,000 gallons per day for the next 24 hours. This notification is pursuant to paragraph 3 in the August 13, 1985 letter to Skyline signed by Dianne R. Nielson.

Mr. Zobell will collect an effluent sample from the sedimentation pond during this 24 hour period. They will notify DOGM should pumping at a rate greater than 240,000 gallons per day past this initial 24 hour period be required. They will send written confirmation of this telephone call to DOGM in a timely manner.
