We recently secured a contract for some stoker coal. Originally we did not anticipate producing any specialty coal here at the Skyline Mines. However, with the current soft coal market, we must take advantage of every sale opportunity that we can.

In order to meet the short term need for this stoker coal contract, we are going to be setting up a temporary screening system. This system will be set up on the already existing coal stock pile. The stock piled coal will be fed through the system, and the stoker sized material screened out. The stoker coal will be hauled out on a continuing basis so there will be no accumulation of this product. The over and undersized material will be put back into the stock pile.

The entire operation is within our permitted area. There will be no new disturbance. All of our surface drainage ditches will be kept open.

We expect to have the system set up and operating by April 18th. We plan on using the system for 3-4 weeks, at which time it will be dismantled and moved out.

For our long term needs, we are looking at a permanent screening system somewhere in our existing coal circuit system. As our plans are firmed up, we will take the necessary steps with the permitting agencies.
