Dear Mr. Thompson:

In accordance with the conditions of NPDES Discharge Permit UT-0023540, Part II - A-2 and Utah Mining Code Section 817.52(b)(i)(ii), Utah Fuel Company is herewith providing the required written notification of a failure to comply with the daily maximum effluent limitation for oil and grease at the 002 discharge point.

The problem occurred in a routine sample taken at 11:15 a.m. on 3/18/87. The oil and grease concentration at this time was observed at 31.1 mg/l. (The maximum limitation is 10 mg/l.) The period of non-compliance is not known. No previous oil and grease problems have been encountered with this discharge.

The data report was received from Ford Laboratory on 4/9/87. The lab has confirmed via telephone that the report is not a typographical error. Action taken to date is to immediately repeat the sample to determine if the problem still exists. Based on past data, this is felt to be an anomalous condition of unknown origin.
