

**SUBJECT: RESPONSE TO DIVISION ORDER 92C AND 92D**

Utah Fuel requested an extension of time to respond to the May 1, 1992 Division deficiency letter from July 31, 1992, until September 30, 1992, for the renewal of our M&RP. We were granted this extension. Included with the May 1, 1992 deficiency letter was Division Order 92C. Although we did not specifically request an extension for Division Order 92C, our intent was to also respond to this order by September 30, 1992. Please confirm that the time extension includes the response to Order 92C.

Division Order 92D was issued to Coastal States Energy Co on June 4, 1992. This order dealt with comments by the U. S. Forest Service. A major portion of their comments are dealing with subsidence issues. We are currently cooperatively involved with the U.S.F.S. to study the effects of subsidence. An environmental analysis is currently being prepared on this issue. We are not prepared to respond to Division Order 92D, until the environmental analysis is complete. We respectfully request a 90-day extension, until 12-1-92, to respond.
