93M, Folders #3 & #5, Carbon County, Utah

The Division has completed a review of the information provided on May 8, 1994, which was provided as part of the abatement requirements for NOV N93-39-5-3 Part #1. The abatement plans are considered adequate for implementation and are hereby approved. You should now proceed to install the measures as proposed in order to achieve field compliance.

Although your plans are adequate for implementation, there are some areas of your plans that need additional support. The following deficiencies have been identified.

1. Figure 3.2.3-3A and the text of page 3-67 show differing values for disturbed area 8. The text or map showing area 30 must be corrected so that the references match the figures.
2. Runoff calculations must be provided for the area to be treated by Alternate Sediment Control Measures in order to demonstrate that the proposed design is adequate. (One calculation showing the worst case scenario may suffice.)
3. A design for the berm at the outslope of the Portal Breakout Area must be provided.


You should incorporate your response to these deficiencies in the copies that will be submitted to complete amendment 93M. Please submit 12 copies of the complete amendment by June 24, 1994 at which time the amendment will be incorporated into your MRP and distributed to other agencies. Thank you for your help
