Utah Fuel Company is providing the required written notification of a failure to comply with maximum thirty-one day average limitation for total iron at the 001 discharge point in accordance with conditions of NPDES Discharge Permit UT-00235540, Part II 1-3 and Utah Coal Mining Rules R45-301-731.223.

The problem occurred with the sample taken 19 March 1996 which had total iron concentrations of 2.34 mg/l which exceeds the maximum thirty-one day average of 2 mg/l. The laboratory report was dated 4 April 1996 but not received until 15 April 1996.


