Dear Interested Party:

Aspen Products Pipeline LLC, Questar Pipeline Company, Kern River Gas Transmission Company, and Colorado Interstate Gas Company have applied for right-of-way grants and a special use permit for a proposed petroleum pipeline and natural gas pipelines. The subject applications cover lands managed by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and United States Forest Service (USFS). The BLM and USFS will be hosting an **additional public scoping meeting in Price, Utah on June 23, 1999**, to gather public input on these applications. **The meeting will be held at the Holiday Inn in Price.** The initial meeting was held on Thursday May 20, 1999, in Price. Meetings were also held in Green River, Utah, Moab, Utah, Salt Lake City, Utah, Lehi, Utah, Dolores, Colorado and Durango, Colorado. The proposed Aspen Pipeline Project will transport a variety of petroleum products to New Mexico, western Colorado, and the Wasatch Front area of Utah using a network of existing and proposed new underground pipelines. The proposed Questar, Kern River Gas Transmission Company, and Colorado Interstate Gas Company projects are put forward to service the current and future need to supply additional capacity for natural gas developed south of Price, Utah, to be transported to markets along the Wasatch Front, Las Vegas or southern California. Under separate application, Questar Pipeline Company is proposing to replace approximately 5 miles of its existing 18 inch Mainline 41 pipeline due to underground mining operations. The proposed reroute is located within the Manti la Sal National Forest. This project will also be analyzed in the EIS. In Colorado, the proposed petroleum pipeline project would occur in Dolores, La Plata, Montezuma and San Miguel Counties. In Utah, the projects would occur in Grand, Emery, Sanpete, Utah, and Salt Lake Counties. The attached map depicts the location of the proposed projects.

The meeting will begin at 7:00 p.m. with a presentation on the proposed projects and the scoping and environmental process by BLM, USFS, Aspen Products Pipeline and Questar Pipeline Company, Kern River Gas Transmission Company, and Colorado Interstate Gas Company representatives. The presentation will be followed by an informal workshop where members of the public can discuss the project with representatives of the BLM, USFS, Aspen Products Pipeline and Questar Pipeline Company Kern River Gas Transmission Company, and Colorado Interstate Gas Company and provide input in the scoping process.


