

We have successfully uploaded the Fall 2000 Water Monitoring Data for Skyline Mine. All sites were monitored and sampled as required in the M&RP. However, the EDI system does not list wells W79-10-1A and W79-14-2B. These wells are no longer accessible for water monitoring because of broken casings in the subsurface or the wells were mined

through. We will be petitioning to drop these and two others that are no longer accessible due to casing damage from our monitoring program.



Additional wells have been added to the monitoring program as part of the UP&L tract submittal. Also, more wells will be added to the program once the Flat Canyon Lease is acquired. If you have any questions regarding this data submittal, please give me a call.
