Hello Tom,

I am reviewing the Skyline Mine plan to reclaim the Mine #1 portals at South Fork. Since you walked over this site recently with Steve Demczak and others, you are probably familiar with the reclamation plan.

The seed mixes in Table 4.7-4 and 4.7-5 of the MRP include yellow sweet clover. It is a non-native that we no longer encourage. Would the Forest Service prefer to take that particular species out of the mix?

I also wonder what your preference is for the reclamation of the roadway where the topsoil has been stored, upstream of the site. Would the Forest Service prefer to leave 4 wheel access or reduce the trail to

a foot path?
