ACTION

Canyon Fuel Company, LLC made application to the Division of Oil, Gas and Mining for a Phase III bond release on .36 acres of reclaimed disturbance associated with the South Fork Breakout access road. No bond money will actually be released. The area will be released from further reclamation liability.

BACKGROUND

The Mining and Reclamation Plan (MRP) for the Skyline Mine was originally approved by the Office of Surface Mining Reclamation and Enforcement (OSMRE) on June 20, 1980. The Permittee was Coastal States Energy Company and the Operator was Utah Fuel Company.

The permit was transferred from Coastal States Energy Company to Canyon Fuel Company, LLC on December 20, 1996.

The Skyline mine plan area incorporates federal coal leases, one Carbon County coal lease and fee lease. The surface disturbed area includes disturbances (surface facilities) on Forest Service lands and private land (Unit Train Loadout and Waste Rock Disposal sites). The access to the Waste Rock Disposal Pit is a private road and is not scheduled for reclamation.

The South Fork Breakout was installed in the early days of the mine and only used for a short period of time. The Breakout area was reclaimed in 2003 and the access road was completely reclaimed in 2005. The area consisting of .96 acres is classified as a Small Area Exemption and sediment control was accomplished using alternative methods rather than installing a sediment pond.

All existing silt fencing was removed, with the exception of temporary silt fencing that was used during reclamation construction. Extreme surface roughening or "deep gouging" was used as the form of sediment control until vegetation was established.

The landowner of the area (U.S. Forest Service) has issued a timber sale for this area and intends to allow logging in this area. When Canyon Fuel Company originally applied for the bond release they also asked for a Post-Mining land use change to logging and indicated as much in the public notice. However, it was later determined that a land use change was not necessary, since the

pre-mining land use of the area included Forestry and logging is compatible with that land use. The Post-Mining land use is not changed. The .36 acre area is being released to accommodate the Forestry land use.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

The Phase III bond release was advertised for four consecutive weeks. No comments were received. The U. S. Forest Service is in favor of the bond release. A bond release inspection was conducted on June 28, 2017. No problems were identified. The technical analysis for the Phase III bond release has been completed with no remaining deficiencies.

RECOMMENDATION

Canyon Fuel Company, LLC has completed the reclamation responsibility for the .36 acre area at the South Fork Breakout. The Phase III bond release should be approved by the Division. The Permittee has not applied for any reduction in the bond amount, only a reduction in the area of permit liability in the amount of .36 acres.

Operation Plan

Mining Operations and Facilities

Analysis:

Te amendment meets the State of Utah R645 requirements for Mining Operations and Facilities; R645-301-231, 521 and 528. The following deficiency was addressed in the October 23, 2017 submittal:

Chapter 3, Page 3-72(a) includes a description of Area 32. The Division is recommending that the strike-out text be retained as it includes the historical chronology of the reclamation of the area which in turn determines when the period of extended responsibility begins. The red-line portion of the text could be added to the text to read as follows:

Area 32. This area is a topsoil storage area in a side drainage of the South FOrk of Eccles Creek, as shown on Map 3.2.11-1. This area is an old roadbed that has been filled in with topsoil from the South Fork Breakout. The area was mulched and seeded in the fall of 1989. A thick cover has become established. There is no visible evidence of soil movement. The permittee ran a Sedcad program to demonstrate the run-off, so the area could be classified as an exempt area (See Vol 5 Sec. 21). The area was re-disturbed in 2003 to reclaim the South Fork Breakout area. The area was roughened and seeded in 2003' then re-disturbed in 2005 to eliminate the footprint of the former roadbed. Extreme surface roughening was the only form of sediment control until vegetation was established. In 2017, as part of a postmining land-use change and partial bond release, Area 32, was removed from the permit and disturbed areas.

The permittee included these suggested text changes in the final clean copy of the amendment.

Reclamation Plan

PostMining Land Use

Analysis:

The application meets the requirements of R645-301-413.300 for an alternative postmining land use, because, in 2017, the USFS included the reclaimed land in a timber sale. The reclaimed road is under federal ownership (about 0.15 mile or 0.36 acres). The reclaimed road will have a post mining land use change from wildlife/grazing to Forestry, to be used

for logging by Timberline Wood Products (USFS correspondence, Skyline Incoming 04062017.pdf).

The topsoil and subsoil piles shown on Dwg 3.2.11-1 Rev 1 at the North end of the road, were consumed in the 2005 reclamation of the South Fork Break Out. The reclaimed 0.6 acres South Fork break out (Chap 1, p. 1-37) will not be removed from the permit area, but will be eligible for Phase III bond release in 2018 (MRP, Sec. 4.7.8). The South Fork Break Out (listed on Chap 1, p. 1-37) was reclaimed in 2005 and supplemental husbandry was completed in 2012. The South Fork reclaimed area was well vegetated and stable on June 28, 2017.

Note: North of the disturbed area boundary, the South Fork access road is on land owned by Canyon Fuel, Co. (Dwg. 1.6-1). Paralleling the road, on the East side of the stream, the land is owned by the Oman Family Trust.

Road System Reclamation

Analysis:

The amendment meets the State of Utah R645 requirements for Road System Reclamation.

R645-301-542.630: The amendment addresses a 0.36 stretch of road that was originally constructed to access a 0.60 acre breakout in South Fork. The breakout was fully reclaimed in 2003, and reclamation of the road followed in 2005. The Permittee proposes to completely remove the 0.36 acres from the permit in anticipation of restoring the reclaimed road to forestry - an acceptable pre-mining land use as defined in Section 2-12 of the MRP. The road will be used by Timberline Wood Products to salvage insect-killed spruce timber in South Fork.

An inspection of the site was accomplished by the Division on 6/28/2017 and it was determined that reclamation efforts appeared successful. The road had been pocked and re-contoured, and vegetative cover had been well established.

Hydrological Information Reclamation Plan

Analysis:

The application meets the State of Utah R645 requirements for Hydrologic Information, Reclamation.

The Division conducted a bond release inspection on June 28th, 2017. The 0.36 acre area cited in the amendment for bond release was walked. The area is stable, free of erosion, and has been successful regraded and revegetated back to the original contour of the surrounding terrain. The sediment and erosion controls taken during and after reclamation have been successful and the natural drainage patterns have been restored.

Revegetation Standards for Success

Analysis:

The amendment meets the State of Utah R645 requirements for Mining Operations and Facilities; R645-301-357.210.

The last augmented seeding at the South Fork breakout, road and topsoil storage pad areas occurred in the fall of 2005. Additional shrub planting occurred in 2011 presumably as a measure to meet the woody species density requirement for the 10 year responsibility period that would have ended at the end of calendar year 2015. On June 21st, 2017 Canyon Fuel Company submitted a post-mining land-use change and bond release for the Forest Service portion of the access road to the reclaimed South Fork portal site. The road will be re-established to accommodate access to a timber sale.

A site visit/bond release inspection was conducted on June 28th, 2017. Persons in attendance walked the reclaimed road to the reclaimed South Fork portal. The reclaimed Forest Service road was stable and well vegetated. Since the PMLU for the .36 acres is a Forest Service access road no vegetation monitoring will be required for bond release.

Maps Bonded Area

Analysis:

The amendment meets the State of Utah R645 requirements for Bonded Area Maps.

R645-301-820.113: The Permittee proposes completely removing a 0.36 acre stretch of reclaimed road in South Fork from the permit in anticipation of restoring the road to forestry - an acceptable pre-mining land use as defined in Section 2-12 of the MRP. The road will be used by Timberline Wood Products to salvage insect-killed spruce timber in South Fork. Although the Permittee is not requesting a reduction of bond amount with this application, this modification would nevertheless release 0.36 acres from the reclamation bond. Maps 3.2.11-1 and 1.6-3 submitted in this amendment clearly illustrate the occlusion of the 0.36 acre road from the Permit Area.

Bonding Determination of Amount

Analysis:

Skyline Mine Post Mining Land Use Change for 0.36 acre portion of the South Fork Breakout meets the requirements of R645 301-830 Determination of Bond Amount and is recommended for approval, based on Skyline Mine is not currently requesting a reduction in the Bond amount and the unsold portion 0.60 acres will continue to be reclaimed per Canyon Fuel Company, LLC's Mining and Reclamation Plan. The modification releases 0.36 acres from Skyline Reclamation Bond so the US Forest Service can use the road portion of the breakout area as a logging road.

1. Permits, Change, Transfer, Renewal, Sale

The application for the post mining land-use change and phase III bond release on the Forest Service access road for .36 acres was received by the Division on June 21, 2017. The road was used to gain access to the South fork of Eccles creek breakout. The parcel is located in township 13 south, Range 6 East, Section 24 a portion of the NESW and was reclaimed several years ago. After reviewing the application and inspecting the area, it is clear that the post mining land use will not actually be changed. The current MRP lists Forestry as land use for the area and having a logging road is certainly consistent with that land use. The U. S. Forest Service has issued a timber sale in the area and has indicated their desire to have the road left for logging. The MRP is being amended to show a change in the reclamation plan for the area so the road can be left rather than totally reclaimed. A notice of the .36 acre bond release will be published in the Sun Advocate on July 11, 18, 25 and August 1, 2017.

4.c Hydrologic Balance: Other Sediment Control Measures

The site has been well stabilized with no signs of sediment leaving the permitted areas.

11. Contemporaneous Reclamation

The South Fork area has been reclaimed and shows good vegetation over the majority of the site. Only .36 acres associated with the access road will be released from liability at this time. The remainder of the South Fork Portal area will remain in the permit and is still slated for full reclamation as shown in the plan.

12. Backfilling And Grading

The south fork breakout was reclaimed in 2003 and the access road in 2005. The road is stable and is showing no signs of erosion.

13. Revegetation

The road is well vegetated blending in well with the surrounding vegetation.

16.a Roads: Construction, Maintenance, Surfacing

The area being evaluated was an access road for the South Fork Portal area. The road has been completely reclaimed and it is difficult to tell that there was ever a road here. The backfilling and grading blend in with the surrounding hillside. Vegetation has become well established although since the road is to be used as a commercial logging road vegetation is not required. There are no signs of instability or erosion.




