Dear Mr. Galecki:

The above-referenced Utah Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (UPDES) permit will expire next year at this time on **April 30, 2020**. The Division of Water Quality (DWQ) likes to provide facilities with ample time to complete and submit the required EPA forms well in advance of the expiration date to help facilitate an on-time permit renewal.

Pursuant to UAC R317-8-3.1(4), all UPDES permittees must apply for reissuance of the permit not less than 180 days prior to the expiration date of the existing permit. A copy of the EPA application forms may be found at <https://deq.utah.gov/legacy/permits/water-quality/utah-pollutant-discharge-elimination-system/forms.htm>.

All applicants for new or renewal permits must complete the EPA forms that are specifically applicable to their facilities. Those facilities filling out EPA Forms 2C, 2D and 2E, must also complete EPA Form 1. **Forms 1 and 2C** are the applicable forms for your facility, but please refer to the table below to confirm as appropriate.

Please complete and return all applicable forms to DWQ as soon as possible, but no later than **July 31, 2019**, so that we can begin to process your permit for an on-time renewal. You must also submit a copy of the applicable forms to the Environmental Protection Agency at the following address:
