Steve,

I'd like to formally request an extension to address the items identified in the Midterm Review (task #5979), from November 22, 2019 to December 31, 2019, for the following reasons:

- * 4th quarter Water Monitoring; the combination of having over 100 monitoring sites located at elevations ranging from 8,000 to 9,200 feet require significant time and focus concentrated on collecting data from these sites in the next few weeks before winter weather prohibits access to various sites.
- * The submittal to included water monitoring sites from the Huntington Canyon Water Monitoring Program (HCWMP) will be submitted later this week
- * An Annual meeting is scheduled with Pacificorp to discuss any modifications to the HCWMP will be conducted in mid-December and may include modifications to the program that will be incorporated into the Midterm submittal
- * Boulder Dam monitoring; Skyline personnel finally met with DWR personnel on October 24 and those comments will be incorporated into the dam monitoring plan (in addition to incorporating the Seismic Station Installation (Task# 6000) that needed to be installed with temporary equipment the week of October 15).
- * As discussed (and reinforced by V. Miller) personnel modifications to the Ownership and Control section (with pending personnel changes) may not be official by November 22.
- * Updating of the Table of Contents will require a fair amount of time and is not a time-sensitive exercise.
- * Installation of continuous monitoring equipment is still being installed.
- * Marking the vegetation reference area locations in the field will require additional field work.
- * A few of the requested map modifications are on mylar (paper-only), with the map needing to be recreated in electronic form.

In closing, requesting a month extension would be just before the Christmas holiday when I anticipate many people will be taking time off, so the December 31 extension would allow for the information to be reviewed a the start of the year.
