Dear Sir:

I apologize for taking so long to return this information to you. I have been waiting on aerial photographs to complete the enclosed map and have been experiencing every delay possible with them.

The map delineates the old Lion Coal refuse pile which has been inactive since the termination of their operations. The area is of three acres.

We have provided the piles with drainage according to M.E.S.A. specifications to insure its stability and have abandoned it as per their requirements.

The only planned activity for the pile is that it may be used as an experimental planting area in the near future, to gain experience in whether or not it is possible to grow our suggested replanting mixture without topsoil on the piles. If this experiment proves successful it may be possible to reclaim our active piles without great amounts of topsoil.

The enclosed map delineates our present active pile, which encompasses 24 acres. The possible future expansion of the pile is also shown and it includes 12 acres.

I hope this provides the rest of the necessary information to allow you to proceed with the surety requirements.
