2, CARBON COUNTY, UTAH.

ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE
No. ACT-007-006

THE STATE OF UTAH TO ALL OPERATORS, TAKERS OF PRODUCTION, MINERAL AND ROYALTY OWNERS, AND PARTICULARLY ALL PERSONS INTERESTED IN TOWNSHIP 15 SOUTH, RANGE 8 EAST, SLBM, CARBON COUNTY, UTAH.

Notice is hereby given that tentative approval was given on November 9, 1976, by the Utah Division of Oil, Gas, and Mining, to Plateau Mining Company, P.O. Box 539, Price, Utah, to continue underground coal mining on owned and State leased lands in portions of Sections 10 and 16, Township 15 South, Range 8 East, SLBM, Carbon County, Utah. The mines are named the Star Point Coal Mines No. 1 and 2. The person representing the company in this matter is Mr. T.F. Bailey, P.O. Box 539, Price, Utah.

Plateau Mining Company has fulfilled obligations under the Mined Land Reclamation Act of 1975 (Section 40-8, U.C.A., 1953, as amended) and will employ the following reclamation techniques on portals and surface facilities of the operation:

During Operations:

- 1) Soil from new surface disturbances will be removed and stockpiled.
- 2) The refuse piles will be constructed to M.E.S.A. regulations.
- 3) Solid waste will be removed to a sanitary landfill.
- 4) Revegetation test plots will be planted in selected areas to gain experience in the best method for final revegetation.
- 5) Mining will be carried out in a safe, orderly, and minerlike manner.

After Operations:

- 1) All portals and vents will be sealed.
- 2) Unusable buildings will be removed along with extraneous debris.
- 3) Surface of refuse piles will be stabilized through seeding or planting.
- 4) All roads will be left open for public use.
- 5) Solid waste landfills will be regraded.
- 6) Revegetation maintenance will include irrigation and grazing protection if found necessary.


Reclamation performance surety will be established upon final approval of the reclamation plan.

Any person or agency aggrieved by this tentative decision is hereby requested to submit written protest within 30 days of November 19, 1976, to

the Division of Oil, Gas, and Mining, 1588 West North Temple, Salt Lake City, Utah, 84116, setting forth factual reasons for his complaint, and thereafter, at a time and place heretobe established, appear before the Board of Oil, Gas, and Mining, to show cause, if any there be, why this plan should not be approved.
