

ADDITIONAL RESPONSE TO STIPULATION 9-22-3 REFUSE EXPANSION

(1) The total area of disturbance and ultimate reclamation encompasses approximately seventy-six surface acres. P.M.C. is committed to distribute a minimum of 10" of soil or whatever quantity is necessary to insure adequate reclamation and a minimum of 80% revegetation. The exact amount necessary will, to a large degree, be correlated to results gained in P.M.C. current research efforts on that portion of the refuse area which will be undergoing reclamation this season.

P.M.C. is committed to store that portion of surplus soil which will not be utilized on the test area, with the intent of utilization on the ultimate reclamation post mining. If in the event our research effort shows conclusively that we have insufficient soil available, the company is committed to purchase off site, if necessary, all additional soil required to insure total reclamation.

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P.M.C. is committed to have a qualified soils expert on site during the removal phase of the PL4 soil type. If any question arises as to suitability of this material to the 60" depth, a spot test will be conducted and the agency will be consulted as to their recommendation prior to utilization.

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P.M.C. is committed to a universal application of 16-16-8 fertilizer at a rate of 200 lb./acre to insure nutrient requirements of the interim reclamation of the top soil stockpile. After redistribution of soil on final reclamation sites, an analysis will be done to determine what nutrients are lacking and P.M.C. will take whatever measures are necessary to insure revegetation.
