Time for Abatement

Thirty days, February 5, 1983.

Although it was not stated in the remedial actions, it is expected that Plateau will remove the contaminated snow from the undisturbed drainage so that melting of this snow doesn't enter the undisturbed drip drain.

Although the violation was not written on the rock dust bin, it is a boardering area and the sediment controls mandated in the letter from the Division dated December 14, 1982, suggest that the abatement for this area will be the same as that to bring the rock dust bin into compliance.

Sand bags are on order to form a runoff barrier between the undisturbed and operations. It is understood that actions to abate the violation may take on a more permanent form once the snow melts and the area becomes more accessible.
