To Whom It May Concern:

Pursuant to the Utah Coal Mining and Reclamation Act (Utah Code Annotated 1953, Section 40-10-1 et seq.), and the "Regulations Pertaining to Surface Effects of Underground Coal Mining Activities" (Final Rules of the Utah Board of Oil, Gas and Mining), the Utah State Division of Oil, Gas and Mining (DOGM) has issued an approval for a permit revision to Plateau Mining Company's (PMC) for their previously approved Star Point Mine (permit application No. ACT/007/006). The approved revision authorizes the permittee (PMC) to proceed with construction of the proposed Unit Train Loadout Facility at the Star Point Mine site. Land to be affected by the revision are contained on the U.S. Geological Survey 7.5 minute "Wattis" quadrangle map and is further identified as:

Township 15 South, Range 8 East, SLBM, Utah; Sec. 10: S1/2SW1/4, SW1/4SE1/4; Sec. 15: N1/2NE1/4, SE1/4NE1/4

Federal Bureau of Land Management Right-of-Way Permit: U-52409.

This permit revision was approved by the DOGM and the Federal Office of Surface Mining (OSM) on September 28, 1984.
