The Utah State Historic Preservation Office received the above referenced documentation on May 4, 1989. We reviewed the New Lands Cultural Resource Inventory provided for Exhibit 4. This consisted of a cultural resource inventory of the proposed mine area by Abajo Archaeology in July of 1987 (U-87-AS-408p,f).

The results of that survey indicated that one prehistoric site (42Em2118) was recorded as a result of the survey. This site was unevaluated for National Register of Historic Places status. This site was located outside of the proposed mine activity areas. It appears that there will be no impacts to this site as a result of this project.
