Dear Mr. Haddock:

This in response to the Utah Division of Oil, Gas, & Mining's (UT-DOG) July 1, 2003, request for a decision, under 30 CFR 944.30, whether the above subject permit renewal constitutes a mining plan modification.

Mining plan approvals by the Secretary of the Interior are required under the Mineral Leasing Act of 1920, 30 U.S.C 181, *et seq.* before coal mining can occur on Federal lands. This letter serves to document OSM's determination whether or not a mining plan approval from the Secretary is required for the above permitting action.

OSM's review of the Application to Discontinue Vegetation Monitoring has determined that it proposes to discontinue future color infrared photographic monitoring of vegetation at the Star Point mine, Utah State permit C/007/006.

Based on a review of the activities associated with the permit revision, OSM has determined that the proposal is administrative in nature and does not meet the requirements of 30 CFR ' 746.11(a) and 746.18(d). Therefore, since no changes in the recovery of Federal coal is involved, the proposed permit revision does not constitute a mining plan action requiring Secretarial approval.

Please notify the applicant of our decision on this matter.

OSM's decision does not, however, relieve UT-DOG from coordinating the review and approval of the Application to Discontinue Vegetation Monitoring with other Federal agencies for compliance with other Federal regulations.
