This letter acknowledges the Office of Surface Mining's (OSM) receipt and review of the above *Phase II Bond Release State Decision Document* (decision) dated January 14, 2009. That decision includes the October 29-30, 2008 inspection report and "Summary of Findings" prepared by the Division of Oil, Gas, and Mining (DOGM). OSM's Denver Field Division (DFD) agrees with the findings in the decision document and hereby provides OSM concurrence for this bond release action in accordance with 30 CFR 740.15 (d) (3), and 30 CFR 944.30, Article IX, of the State-Federal Cooperative Agreement.

A thorough summary of the operational and reclamation history of the mine are accurately captured in the bond release application. The required public, governmental agency, and landowner notifications of the bond release application were provided by the permittee and are documented in the bond release application and subsequent correspondence.

The bond release inspection notifications provided by DOGM are documented either in the decision, the report for the bond release inspection that was conducted by DOGM on October 29-30, 2008, or related correspondence. DOGM sent an invitation letter informing interested parties of the bond release inspection on October 14, 2008. Inadvertently, OSM was not notified of or invited to the inspection and therefore did not participate. One attendee from the U.S. Bureau of Land Management (BLM) participated with DOGM personnel and the permittee's designated representative in the bond release inspection.

DOGM received a letter from the BLM concurring with the Phase II bond release on December 1, 2008, and the U.S. Forest Service, Manti-La Sal Forest concurred by letter dated January 7,

2009 (copies enclosed). No other federal, state, or local government agencies are required to provide a concurrence for this bond release action. No written comments on the bond release application from the public, governmental agencies, affected surface landowners, or adjacent landowners are discussed by DOGM in their findings or decision document. DOGM's decision demonstrates the applicant's compliance with the Utah approved regulatory program at Rule R645-301-800, Bonding and Insurance. Phase II bond release criteria found in the above regulatory provision(s) have been met or exceeded by the permittee.

OSM has reviewed DOGM's *Phase II Bond Release State Decision Document* and bond release inspection report, as well as other pertinent documentation including maps, photographs, and the public notice. Phase I bond release criteria were previously met or exceeded by the permittee on this site and 95.3 acres were approved by DOGM for release on October 12, 2004. Revegetation establishment criteria are discussed in the "Summary of Findings" portion of the decision document and on page 6 of DOGM's inspection report. Analysis of the hydrologic balance is discussed on pages 3 and 4 of the inspection report, and the decision document recommends Phase II bond release due to the permittee's demonstration that sediment is being controlled over the reclaimed area. OSM finds that Phase II bond release criteria have been met or exceeded by the permittee on the 95.3 acres proposed for release.

The current amount of bond held for reclamation of the site is \$3,118,400.00 and the bond amount proposed for Phase II bond release is \$1,937,400.00. As noted above, this Phase II bond release applies to 95.3 acres of reclaimed disturbance which includes the surface facilities area in Sage Brush Canyon, the Unit Train Loadout area, #1 Mine and the breakouts in Corner Canyon and Mud Water Canyon. DOGM has determined that granting this release will reduce the current amount of bond for remaining reclamation liability at the site to \$1,181,000.00. This remaining bond will ensure environmental monitoring and reclamation success through Phase III bond release. Thus, DOGM's proposed release of \$1,937,400.00 from the current amount noted above leaves sufficient bond to make certain that all remaining reclamation requirements will be completed at the Star Point Mine, Utah Permit No. C/007/006.

OSM concurs with the findings in DOGM's Phase II bond release decision, and the Phase II bond monies proposed for release as documented above.
