Dear Mr. Huefner:

The Division has reviewed Kaiser Steel Corporation's request to construct a replacement power line at the Sunnyside Mine Complex. Due to the inadvertent delay in handling the request by the Division and the time constraints placed on Kaiser Steel Corporation, the Division hereby issues approval to Kaiser Steel Corporation to construct a 46 kv power line from the Central Metering Station to the Branch Fuse Disconnect Station in Whitmore Canyon.

As a conditional approval to a minor modification to the existing Kaiser Steel-Sunnyside interim mine plan, this approval is subject to review and final approval of the permanent program submission. This approval to Kaiser Steel Corporation, herein the Applicant, is conditioned on compliance with the following stipulations:

Stipulation 7-81-1

Within 15 days of the date of this conditional approval, the Applicant agrees to provide the Utah Division of Oil, Gas and Mining (DOGM) with a topographic map of proper scale delineating the existing power line, the new power line, all areas to be disturbed by construction and the locations of all power poles.

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Stipulation 7-81-2

Within 15 days of this approval, the Applicant shall provide DOGM with a narrative describing a plan and schedule of reclamation for the disturbance area associated with the new power line, as well as the area previously disturbed by the existing power line, if it is to be removed.

Stipulation 7-81-3

The Applicant will remove all topsoil prior to construction to a minimum depth of six inches (UMC 817.22). This soil shall be temporarily protected from construction activity and respread and reseeded promptly following construction (UMC 817.111).

Stipulation 7-81-4

The Applicant agrees to obtain and provide to DOGM a letter from the Division of Wildlife Resources stating that "the power line and its construction will have no adverse impact on raptors."
