Enclosed for your information is a copy of the BLM Branch of Solid Minerals, concurrence letter regarding the Resource Recovery and Protection Plan for the Sunnyside mine. This letter, together with the February 3, 1984, letter from the Moab office of BLM, completes all required BLM concurrence on the Sunnyside application.

The only Federal agency concurrence which we have not yet obtained for the Sunnyside application, is a Fish and Wildlife Service determination regarding water depletion effects on endangered Colorado River fishes. We continue to pursue this matter and expect to have a response from the Fish and Wildlife Service around the end of June.

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The two submittals of subject information identified and listed below have been reviewed for completeness and technical adequacy:

1. A package with one map and pages forwarded with your letter (not dated) and identified as, "12/20/83 submittal of revisions for mining and reclamation plan regarding change in surface ownership."

2. A package of maps and pages forwarded with your letter dated March 19, 1984, and identified as "03/07/84 submittal of revisions for mining and reclamation plan in response to 01/31/84 UT DOGM draft technical analysis."

This information appears to be compatible with 43 CFR 3482.1(c) rules and regulations and will not affect proposed coal recovery procedures or cause any conflicts with future recovery of the resource.

Accordingly, we have determined that the Resource Recovery and Protection Plan (R2P2) or the underground mining part of the subject PAP on file in this office is in compliance with 43 CFR 3482.1(c) rules and regulations. The proposed coal recovery procedures will safely obtain maximum recovery of the resource using current technology and available mining equipment. Also; the R2P2 part of the PAP is adequate for BLM administration of the associated leases.
