Compliance with Permanent Performance Standards

UMC 771 et al Permits

A letter dated May 11, 1978 from Ron Daniels of the Division grants tentative approval for the Sunnyside Mine.

A letter from the Division dated January 9, 1984, signed by Jim Smith gives approval for the Manshaft Sediment pond.

A letter dated June 12, 1984 from Doug Pearce of Kaiser Steel requests approval for the Mine water pond at the Whitmore Shaft.

Approval was granted on August 15, 1984 for the Grassey Trail Crossing, Sediment Pond and Mine Water Pond. The letter is signed by Ron Daniels.

UMC 817.11 Signs and Markers

The mine entrance sign was visible with all pertinent information listed. Perimeter markers were also noted around the mine site.

UMC 817.21 Topsoil

Topsoil stockpiles were viewed and found to be acceptable. No problems were noted.

UMC 817.41-.52 Hydrologic Balance

The straw bales have been maintained since the last inspection.

The oil barrels stored at this site now contain water soluble oil. If spills occur and the oil passes through the straw bales, Kaiser will be liable for resulting enforcement action. No leaks were noted at this time and full barrels were being stored in an upright fashion.

The newly reconstructed Manshaft Sediment Pond has somewhat progressed. The new discharge pipe was being installed and decant pipes were being constructed.

Now that the Division has made its determination as to the small area exemption applications, Kaiser Steel is responsible for implementing controls where indicated. Straw bale protection was directed at various spots and Mr. Allred took appropriate notes.

UMC 817.52 Hydrologic Balance: Water Monitoring

The NPDES permit was available upon request. Permit number UT.0022941 is dated October 29, 1982 and has an expiration date of June 30, 1987.

The most recent water quality dates available was dated September 19, 1984. No quality problems were noted.

UMC 817.100 Contemporasion Reclamation

The Slaughter Canyon area was viewed for potential reclamation success. The area is doing very well especially transplanted sagebrush.

UMC 817.121-126 Subsidence Control

The area is being flown every four months, with individual points being monitored at that time.
