A partial inspection was conducted on January 11, 1984 at the above mentioned mine site by Barton Kale of the Division. The inspector was accompanied by Doug Pearce of Kaiser Steel Corporation.


The field tour revealed no major problem other than normal winter maintenance (culverts, drainages etc). The road to the manshaft area is plowed now and the area was reviewed for the first time in about two months with no problem.

The sediment ponds that Kaiser committed to completing are finished according to Mr. Pearce. Due to the snow cover amount of completeness could not be ascertained.

The snow depth at the mine site is fairly substantial at this time. Due to the lack of direct sunlight (canyon topography) it is expected that snow cover will last continuously for another three months (at least).

Snow removal is adequate at this time. Undisturbed drainages are being protected from contaminated snow.

Organization of the storage yard looks much improved over years past. Ditch maintenance, berms, equipment organization as well as the new sediment control structures contribute to this.
