Folder No. (3) and 4, Carbon County, Utah


Our final small area exemption determination has been finalized for the No. 2 Mine outcrop fan site (Fan Canyon). After visiting the site on October 12, 1984, Division Hydrologists John Whitehead and Tom Munson determined that the existing two straw bale dikes are serving their purpose of alternative sediment control. Vegetation is growing in and around these dikes and providing additional sediment filtration. It is imperative these dikes are maintained and checked regularly by the applicant to detect any leakage of sediment or signs of erosion.

Berms and swales which direct the disturbed drainage to these straw bale dikes must also be maintained as needed to allow this area to function properly and provide adequate filtration. Any new plans for rock gabion structures or silt fence installations should be passed by the Division hydrologists for approval before implementation.
