The Office of Surface Mining Reclamation and Enforcement (OSMRE), Western Field Operations (WFO), has received the October 24, 1986, Kaiser Coal Company's submittal of an amendment to the approved mine reclamation plan of Utah permit No. ACT/007/007-860 for the Sunnyside mine. The applicant requested to modify the underground water monitoring system. The Division of Oil, Gas and Mining (DOGM) granted partial approval to this request by allowing relocation of the No. 3 mine slope monitoring station. OSMRE reviewed this action and determined that it does not constitute a modification to the approved mining plan under 30 CFR 746.18. OSMRE concurs with DOGM's decision to approve this relocation as stated in DOGM's letter dated November 17, 1986, and the Federal permit UT-014-6, dated January 7, 1986, is revised accordingly.
