This letter is in response to the question you raised in our meeting of August 5, 1986 regarding incidental boundary changes. As we discussed, the current rule UMC 700.5 requires that incidental boundary changes cannot exceed 1 percent of the permit area or 10 acres, whichever is smaller, and are cumulative over the 5 year permit term.

Since the permit revision of approximately 150 acres for the Sunnyside Mines was approved just prior to the effective date of the rule change requiring IBC's be cumulative over the 5 year permit term, the Kaiser Sunnyside permit does not have any accumulated incidental boundary change acreage to date for the current 5 year permit term.

Please let me know if there is any further information I can provide you with on this matter.
