Re: Report on the Compliance Status of Kaiser Coal Corporation

You inquired on January 3, 1986 for the status of Kaiser Coal Corporation activities in Utah. Specifically, you asked if Kaiser Coal Corporation had any outstanding Notices of Violation (NOV's), or Cessation Orders (CO's), outstanding fines, or if the company had a demonstrated pattern of willful violations in the state of Utah.

The standard which Utah uses in responding to inquiries of this type is whether a permit would be issued under the Utah Coal Regulatory Program.

Kaiser Coal Corporation has an interest in three mines in the state of Utah, the Sunnyside Mine, Geneva Mine, and the Wellington Preparation Plant.

As of the writing of this letter, there are no NOV's or CO's which are not corrected or in the process of being corrected. Any NOV's or CO's that are outstanding are in the process of administrative or judicial review. Also, there are no finalized civil penalties which are outstanding and overdue in the name of Kaiser Coal Corporation.

Finally, Kaiser Coal Corporation does not have a demonstrated pattern of willful violations for any operation in the state of Utah.
