



Re: Borrow Area Sediment Pond
Construction Permit

Gentlemen:

We have reviewed plans and supporting documents for the construction of the Borrow Area Sediment Pond. The documents were submitted to us on July 26, 1988.

The plans and specifications, as submitted, comply with *the Utah Wastewater Disposal Regulations*. A **construction permit**, as constituted by this letter, is issued subject to the following conditions:

1. *Any modification to the approved plans and specifications must be reviewed and approved before implementation to the prospective bidders or the contractor as applicable.*
2. *Facilities constructed under this permit must not be placed in service until the Bureau of Water Pollution Control has completed a final inspection, and has authorized you to do so.*
3. *The current Utah Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit must be amended to include this facility before placing the pond in service.*
4. *The pond shall be operated in such a manner that will assure the liquid level is at or below the decant level except during storm events.*

If the approved project is not under construction within one year, then it will become necessary to resubmit the plans and specifications for reissuance of the construction permit.

The project consists of construction of an earthen pond capable of containing 100 percent sediment and 329 percent runoff from a 10-year, 24-hour storm event. The pond is provided with a decant for dewatering purposes.

Kaiser Coal Corporation
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Please provide us with an additional set of plans and supporting documents for our records. A set of approved plans and supporting documents is returned herewith bearing our construction permit stamp. This set of plans must be kept available for examination and inspection to be conducted by a representative of the Bureau of Water Pollution Control, and for resolution of and conflicts or discrepancies in construction that may arise.

Please advise us of the beginning of construction. This will enable us to monitor the progress and schedule periodic inspections.
