On September 23, 1997, Forest Supervisor Janette Kaiser made a decision to consent to competitive leasing of the Mill Fork Lease Tract (Federal Coal Lease Application UTU-71307) by the Bureau of Land Management. The tract is located on the Manti-La Sal National Forest in Emery County, Utah.

The following notice of intent to construct, submitted in accordance with Section R307-1-3.1, Utah Air Conservation Rules, has been received for consideration by the Executive Secretary, Utah Air Quality Board:

Project Location: Take Highway 6 east from Wellington, Utah, and travel 2 miles, turn right and follow road for 1 miles to tailings impoundment.

Project Description: Covol Technologies has developed a patented process for reclaiming coal tailings impoundments. Covol will be installing this new facility between Price and Wellington in Carbon County. This area is in compliance with the national air quality standards. New source Performance Standards subpart A and Y apply to this source. Title V applies to this source.

The engineering evaluation and air quality impact analysis have been completed and no new violations of National Ambient Air Quality Standards or Prevention of Significant Deterioration Increments will occur. It is the intent of the Executive Secretary to approve the construction project.

The construction proposal and estimates of the effect on local air quality are available for public inspection and comment at the Division of Air Quality, Utah State Department of Environmental Quality, 150 North 1950 West, Salt Lake City, Utah 84114-4820. Written comments received by the Division, at the same address on or before October 18, 1997, will be considered in making the final decision on the approval/disapproval of the proposal construction.

If anyone so requests to the Executive Secretary at the Division in writing, within 15 days of publication of the Notice, a hearing will be held to explain the project and technical rationale for proposed action. A hearing will be scheduled as close as practicable to the proposed project location. Comments obtained during a hearing will be evaluated and considered by the Executive Secretary before making a final decision on the approval/disapproval of the project.
