GENERAL INFORMATION:

On June 30, 1980, V. Garth Norman, Staff Archeologist, and his field crew, all of AERC, performed an intensive archeological surface evaluation of a well location and access road for Eureka Energy Company. The location (see map) is situated in Section 14, Township 13 South, Range 12 East; and the access road is situated in Sections 23 and 14 of Township 13 South, Range 12 East in Carbon County, Utah.

Methodology:

The archeologist and his crew walked a series of parallel transects across the proposed well location. A 30-meter wide corridor on the west side of the canyon, just above the creek level, was also evaluated.

RESULTS:

No cultural resources of any historic or prehistoric period were observed or recorded during the survey.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

AERC recommends that a cultural resource clearance be granted to Eureka Energy Company for the above well location based upon their adherence to the following stipulations:

1. All vehicular traffic, personnel movement and construction to be confined to the location examined and to access roads leading into this location.
2. All personnel refrain from collecting individual artifacts or from disturbing any cultural resources in the area.


3. A qualified archeologist be consulted should cultural remains from subsurface deposits be exposed during construction work or if the need arises to relocate or otherwise alter the construction area.
