

The requirements for 7-81-5-G, location and details of the diversion ditch above the coal pile and loadout area, have been adequately provided. The Division acknowledges compliance of U. S. Fuel Company to Stipulation 7-81-5-G.

Stipulation 7-81-5-H requires the applicant to submit topographic maps delineating the watershed boundary areas utilized to assess the acreage values given for sizing the sediment control structures (i.e., sediment ponds, diversions, etc). The Division requests that the applicant submit a topographic map outlining the areas requested per stipulation and demonstrate that said structures are adequately sized. The above information will be required by the Division before compliance with Stipulation 7-81-5-H can be approved.
