1. PERMIT -

The Dryer Pond "as-built" was reviewed in the field. The drawing was complete and accurate with final construction. The pond drawing is under review and approval at the division.

2. SIGNS AND MARKERS -

The operator has installed additional perimeter markers at the railroad tracks, since the last inspection. Several markers were missing due to vandalism.

4a. DIVERSION -

Several diversions have been cleaned out since the last inspection. The ditches were spot checked and were clear of obstructions.

4b. SEDIMENT POND AND IMPOUNDMENTS -

The sediment ponds were not discharging water during the inspection. All ponds were dry, except the rail loadout pond. There were no signs of erosion to inlets or outlets of the ponds. The structure appeared to be stable with no hazardous conditions existing.

7. REFUSE PILES -

The Course Refuse Pile may come under a division order for up-dating the Mining and Reclamation Plan concerning contemporaneous reclamation of the first lift. The division order is under review in Salt Lake City DOGM.
