The following information is submitted in response to your letter dated April 20, 1983.

1. As you are aware, U. S. Steel Mining Company is currently preparing a response to the Apparent Completeness Review for the Wellington Coal Preparation Plant. The location of the proposed natural gas line will be added to the facilities map and submitted with the ACR response.
2. The pipeline will be buried 24 to 30 inches deep. It is currently anticipated that polyethylene pipe will be installed. The pipeline will be constructed to meet Mountain Fuel Supply Company requirements.
3. Detailed plans for reclamation will be included in the ACR response.

It is planned to install the pipeline immediately adjacent to the paved access road to the Preparation Plant. This will result in a minimum of surface disturbance. It is anticipated that the surface disturbance along this road would be approximately the same size as the required pipe trench (possibly one to two feet). Other disturbances would be in paved and unpaved yard areas. Because of the small size of the disturbance and its location, U. S. Steel Mining Company does not feel any temporary stabilization is needed.
