Dear Sharon:

The following outstanding issues from the permit transfer approval at Wellington were listed on the January 10, 1992 letter to Jon Passic (CVR) from Lowell Braxton (DOGM). I have written a few notes after each stipulation. I think we have addressed all of them, but I wanted to write you a personal note to confirm this.

Stipulation R614-301-112.500

I believe Denise Dragoo (Fabian & Clendenin) has been in touch with you about this stipulation. In her letter and enclosures to you dated March 25, 1992, she addressed the issue.

Stipulation R614-301-116.100

I have included with this letter a page that, if acceptable, will replace the same page number in the new MRP.

Stipulation R614-301-121

I believe the Ms. Dragoo also addressed this stipulation in the documents that she sent you with the exception of the map.

We had already supplied DOGM with a map that showed the permit boundary to be the same one as the legal description states. However, we are again revising Map E9-3341. It is in "draft" form now pending the outcome of some refuse pile work (you will receive an explanation in the permit amendment dated April 5, 1992). I have included a "draft" copy of this map for you to examine and make comments. I will send you a copy of the "final" when it is completed. The final will replace the E9-3341 in the new MRP.

Castle Valley Resources (Genwal) began operations as a coal loadout in 1989 upon permit transfer. Since that time, approval for a study for fines removal has also been attained. CVR is anticipated to utilize the site for a loadout for a 30-yr period (unless the coal market changes substantially). Other operations are anticipated in the future, but feasibility plans are still being conducted. Reclamation would begin at the end of the 30-yr period (unless the coal fines removal proves economically feasible, of which would be considered preliminary reclamation procedures).
