1. PERMITS, CHANGE, TRANSFER, RENEWAL, SALE

No amendment has been submitted by the permittee to the Division.

4A. HYDROLOGIC BALANCE: DIVERSIONS

The diversion were spot-checked and complied with the requirements of the MRP and the R645 Coal Rules.

4B. HYDROLOGIC BALANCE: SEDIMENT PONDS AND IMPOUNDMENTS

All sediment ponds were dry and no hazardous conditions were noticed.

The permittee has been pumping water into the slurry ponds. This is to reduce the possibility of coal dust from leaving the disturbed area.

4C. HYDROLOGIC BALANCE: OTHER SEDIMENT CONTROL MEASURES

Silt fences and straw bales were spot-checked and complied with the requirements of the MRP.

4D. HYDROLOGIC BALANCE: WATER MONITORING

The permittee was informed that the Division will not accept "No access" to the water-monitoring sites as a way of complying with the requirements of the MRP and the R645 Coal Rules.

7. COAL MINE WASTE/REFUSE PILES/IMPOUNDMENTS

The refuse piles were inspected and no hazardous conditions were noticed.

8. NONCOAL WASTE

The disturbed area was clear of non-coal waste material.

No construction has taken place since the last inspection.
