Dear Mr. Sides:

Pursuant to U.S. Steel's decision to close the Geneva Mine in Horse Canyon, I would like to bring to your attention UMC 817.131 Cessation of Operations: Temporary as found in Utah's Permanent Program regulations. According to Part (b) a notice of intention to cease mining activities should be filed with the Division 30 days prior to or as soon as it is known that a temporary cessation will extend beyond 30 days. At this time it appears that mining cessation will extend beyond 30 days.

U.S. Steel is recommended to submit a notice of cessation as outlined in UMC 817.131(b). Additionally, I would like to point out UMC 817.131(a), stating that surface facilities should be maintained for compliance with the Act and Regulations.
