Hello Jay,

When you are putting together the historic information, please keep in mind the following requirements of the regulations: R645-301-411.140 through 411.144.

These regulations indicate that the application will contain maps clearly showing the location of any cultural or historical resources listed or eligible for listing. The application will include a supporting narrative describing the nature of the cultural and historic resources listed or legible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places within the permit and adjacent areas. The narrative will also describe coordination efforts with and present evidence of clearances by SHPO. R645-301-411.143 indicates that the Division may require the collection of additional information, conducting field investigations or other appropriate analyses.

I would think that a phone call or visit to the Emery County Archives in Castle Dale or a call to the Carbon County Historical Society (Eldon Miller) might turn up some early photographs. The Utah State Historical Society (300 South Rio Grand, SLC) has quite a collection of photographs as well; their index is searchable by name and subject.
