The Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP) recently received your notification and supporting documentation regarding the adverse effects of the referenced undertaking on properties eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. This letter is to inform you that the ACHP has decided not to participate in consultation for this undertaking. However, if we receive a request from your agency, the State Historic Preservation Officer, Tribal Historic Preservation Officer, or another party requesting our participation, we may reconsider our decision. Additionally, should circumstances change, and you determine that our participation is needed to conclude the consultation process, please notify us.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 800.6(b)(1)(iv), you will need to file the final Programmatic (PA) and related documentation with the ACHP at the conclusion of the consultation process. The filing of the Agreement with the ACHP is required in order to complete the requirements of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.
