The Utah Preservation Office has received additional information for consideration of the Gordon Creek No. 2 mine plan. This letter updates our letter of March 22, 1983.

After review of the material provided, our office understands that a decision has been made to consider the sites in the mine plan (42Cb209 - 212) as eligible for the National Register. Our office would concur with these determinations of eligibility.

It is understood at this time these sites will not be affected by any action of the mine plan, but if in future there are changes, we understand that you will inform the Office of Surface Mining, and mitigation plans will be adopted.
